Yoyogi International School offers classes from Kindergarten to Grade 8, following the International Baccalaureate Primary Years Programme (PYP) for Grades K–5 and Project-Based Learning for Grades 6–8. Our curriculum emphasizes inquiry-based learning, promoting holistic development and intercultural understanding.

Admissions Terms and Conditions 2025–2026

- Please contact the Admissions Department to check availability before applying.
- We accept applications for enrollment in all grade levels for the next two terms, as long as the class has not reached its capacity.
- Applications received after a class has reached its capacity, or applications for future enrollment beyond the next two terms, will be placed in our wait pool.
- Yoyogi International School reserves the right not to disclose information concerning admissions procedures, applicant personal information, or the number of applicants in the wait pool.
- Your application will be reviewed only after all required information and the application fee have been received.
- All application forms must be typed and completed accurately and thoroughly.
- We will not consider applications for grade levels that do not align with our age/class placement criteria.
- The application fee of **33,000 JPY (tax inclusive, per student)** is non-refundable under any circumstances, regardless of the admissions decision. Once the fee is received, your application will be reviewed, and we may or may not invite the student for a screening.
- All students must participate in a screening in order to be considered for enrollment. This session
 can be conducted online or in person. Parents are not required to be present. The screening
 consists of Math and English literacy assessments based on the student's most recent grade
 level, along with a conversation with our Admissions team. If the student receives assistance or
 translation during the screening, the application will not be considered.
 Except for Japanese language lessons, all classes are conducted in English. Students with
 limited English ability, as determined through the application form, screening, or testing, will be
 required to take English as Additional Language (EAL) support (a fee-based service).
- Yoyogi International School may not have the facilities or staffing necessary to support students
 with learning needs beyond what can be accommodated within the mainstream program.
 Enrollment is contingent upon confirmation through previous school reports and screening that
 the student's learning needs can be supported.

Enrollment Confirmation

- For Individual/General Enrollment: Enrollment is confirmed upon payment of the tuition fee.
- **For Corporate or Embassy Sponsorship**: Enrollment is confirmed upon submission of the corporate or embassy payment agreement and payment of the registration fee.
